

Hidradenitis Suppurativa

Clinical And Translational Studies

1. Pruritus is a frequently reported symptom in hidradenitis suppurativa, which can be explained by the presence of eosinophils, CCL-26, and neurogenic inflammation in the hidradenitis suppurativa infiltrate – *this thesis*.
2. Adalimumab, infliximab, and prednisolone are more potent than secukinumab, ustekinumab, and rituximab in reducing pro-inflammatory cytokines in ex vivo hidradenitis suppurativa skin – *this thesis*.
3. Apremilast is a valuable addition to the armamentarium for the treatment of hidradenitis suppurativa – *this thesis*.
4. The in vivo expression of inflammatory markers does not correlate with the clinical efficacy of apremilast in patients with hidradenitis suppurativa – *this thesis*.
5. Laser depilation but not microwave ablation ameliorates mild hidradenitis suppurativa – *this thesis*.
