Implementation of primary hrHPV-based cervical cancer screening in the Netherlands: Changes and challenges across the screening process

- 1) The implementation of hrHPV screening in the Netherlands has led to an increase in the detection of CIN 2+ lesions with a corresponding increase in unnecessary referrals. (this thesis)
- 2) The decline in participation in the Dutch cervical cancer screening programme since the introduction of HPV screening is at least partly due to removal of self-inviting GPs from the programme. (this thesis)
- 3) Implementing hrHPV genotyping will reduce unnecessary referrals without requiring major changes to the current programme infrastructure. (this thesis)
- 4) Both under- and overtreatment of CIN lesions occurred following referral from the old Dutch cervical cancer screening programme, despite clinical guidelines being available. (this thesis)
- 5) Knowing that a screening test is HPV positive may influence the cytological rating of the slide. (this thesis)
- 6) Plain packaging legislation delivers a double blow to the profits of the tobacco industry by reducing overall sales and increasing price sensitivity. (Australian Department of Health, 2016 and Bonfrer, et al, *Marketing Science*, 2020)
- 7) Skin cancer prevention is as simple as 'slip, slop, slap, seek and slide!'. (Tabbakh et al, *PLoS Medicine*, 2019)
