

Genea Canelles Propositions

1. The sharing economy has diverse meanings in practice lacking a clear and sound scientific conceptualization and definition. (Thesis related)
2. The proliferation of no-scientific conceptualizations has negatively affected the sharing economy cognitive legitimization and acceptance by different stakeholders (Thesis related)
3. Due to the resistance in the sector legitimization, local regulators have mostly opted for restrictive governance frames showing no adaptive capacities to co-evolve with the phenomenon (Thesis related)
4. The sector unfavourable regulation is the result of the unstable sector legitimization and the restrictive governance (Thesis related)
5. A partner-up approach can help to tackle the negative externalities of the sharing economy, while taking advantage of its potentialities (Thesis related)
6. Multiple stakeholders' participation in the policy decision-making process is necessary to arrive to sustainable transitions
7. Cities can turn into greater experimental laboratories for social innovation if provided with the adequate resources
