**“TCR TRANSLOCATIONS AT THE NORMAL-MALIGNANT
T CELL INTERFACE”**

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1. The V(D)J recombination machinery is not the driver, but rather the facilitator in the formation of TCR translocations and non-TCR chromosomal aberrations in T-ALL. (This thesis)
2. DNA double strand breaks in breakpoint cluster regions are primarily induced in the presence of a genetic element of sequence vulnerability, while breaks at single breakpoint sites lacking such elements of vulnerability are more likely induced by chance or perhaps due to a patient specific genetic vulnerability. (This thesis)
3. The time frame of the V(D)J recombination process at the TCR locus primarily determines the “window of opportunity” for a TCR translocation to occur. (This thesis)
4. Nuclear spatial organization of TCR and oncogene loci in thymocytes is random. (This thesis)
5. Genetic vulnerability to double stand break induction primarily determines the frequency of TCR translocation formation, but the positive selection by the oncogenic effect resulting from the translocation determines the frequency of oncogene involvement in T-ALL. (This thesis)
6. Genetic changes occur in development of cancers, but there also are epigenetic changes and those come first. (Adapted from A. Feinberg M.D., Press release Johns Hopkins Medicine [online], 2005)
