What Happened to Autonomy?

Visual arts practices in the creative industries era.

- 1. Absolute autonomy does not exist because everybody is subject to external influences all the time.
- 2. Conceptualism is the new autonomy because the idea is at the centre and not the object itself.
- 3. Because of capitalism, autonomous art is committing suicide. The generation of individual income has become so naturally compulsory that 'art for arts sake' cannot be justified anymore.
- 4. We are on the verge of a social redefinition of what an artist is by making cultural entrepreneurialism obligatory.
- 5. Once a certain minimum standard of economic capital is guaranteed, income is not money but personal well-being.
- 6. Reality is subject to methodology. Different empirical truths can convey different outcomes.
- 7. The medium defines the artist and his perception of autonomy. There is not one single type of visual artists.
- 8. Social autonomy creates artistic autonomy by offering the possibility to make decisions out of choice, not necessity.
- 9. Heterogeneity creates autonomy because it creates the opportunity to choose in the first place.
- 10. The social responsibility of artists is to become an entrepreneur in order to become sustainable.
- 11. Scientific work practices consist of 85% running against walls and 15% finding doors. Behind each door one will ever only find more walls, and more doors.
