- 1. Environmental problems caused by small and medium enterprises require more than a single standard solution. (This thesis)
- 2. Local politics and a lack of capacities are likely to reduce local government's ability to influence the environmental behaviour of polluting firms, despite its legal authority. (This thesis)
- 3. Local community leaders are better able to play a role in local community's collective action when the social capital of a community is higher. (This thesis)
- 4. The influence of one single actor cannot be judged individually as there is not necessarily a link between that actor and entrepreneurs' environmental response. (This thesis)
- 5. A systematic consideration of all relevant actors and the underlying factors influencing their behaviours, alliances and opponents, and interactions gives a better understanding of and facilitates the finding of appropriate solutions to environmental issues. (This thesis)
- Certification with 3rd party verification could be a potentially effective instrument to stimulate large firms to behave responsibly, while responsible practice in SMEs tends to rely on personal ethics and relationships with close stakeholders.
- Decentralization tends to improve natural resource management in developed countries but much less so in developing countries.
- 8. Public participation is as significant as government action in ensuring the successful implementation of sustainable development.
- Social cooperation between participants is negatively affected by the heterogeneity of their assets, information and pay-offs which lead to higher transaction costs and conflict over benefits and costs distribution.
- 10. The government is better able to monitor and control large firms' environmental performance than that of SMEs.
